

Mugello Circuit, owned by Ferrari since 1988, is an important sports facility hosting national and international events of different nature and size. Along with its track of 5,245 meters and 15 curves, it occupies a total area of 170 hectares, and winds through the gentle slopes of the Tuscan hills. Each year, the circuit hosts 15 race weekends and 250 days of track activity. The most important event and attendance is the MotoGP Grand Prix of Italy that attracts about 120,000 spectators every year.

Mugello Circuit, already strongly committed to improving the quality of its business processes (ISO 9001 certification), its environmental impact (EMAS and ISO 14001 certifications), health and safety of workers (OHSAS 18001 certification) and therefore already sensitive to environmental and social impact themes, want to adopt a further system of management of its plant in the clearest form, direct and internationally recognized, obtaining ISO 20121 certification, which is the international standard for the sustainable management of events hosted by it.

This decision leads to the implementation of the values promoted by the standard itself and by this policy, such as:

- responsible management,
- participation,
- continuous improvement.

Mugello Circuit intends to further enhance its plant from the point of view of sustainability to 360° stimulating every possible action in the short, medium and long term to reduce environmental impacts and, at the same time, enhancing the social and economic repercussions produced by the events hosted. This is an important attention for involvement of all stakeholders (organizers, Federations, customers, employees, suppliers, riders, teams, guests, media, sponsors and communities).

With this in mind, Mugello Circuit is committed to:

- Respect the basic principles of sustainable development and contribute to the achieving the goals set by the United Nations (UN SDG-Sustainable Development Goals);
- Manage the circuit on the principles and values listed above (transparency, integrity, inclusiveness, accessibility, legacy, responsible management, participation and continuous improvement);
- Raise awareness and involve all stakeholders around environmental, economic and social sustainability;
